THIS YEAR'S LONG TERM GOALS:

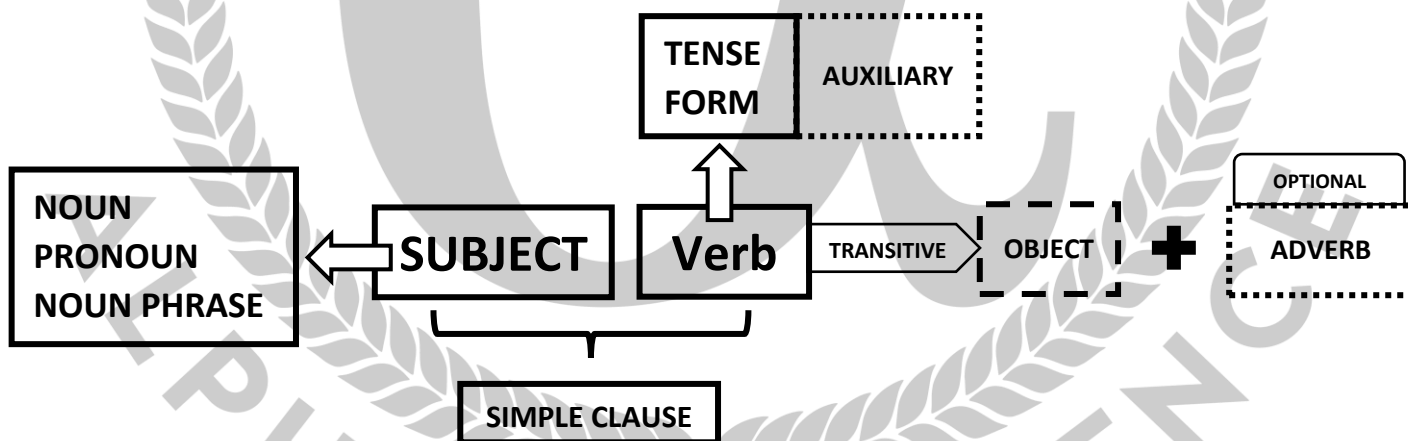
- Reading and understanding the ideas mentioned in a paragraph.
