

Future Perfect Simple & Continuous

Context of Use: The Future Perfect is a tense that expresses the idea that something will occur before another action. It can also show that something will happen before a specific time. It is generally used with expressions like by, by then, by that time, by the 24th, and by 2070...

Future perfect simple Form: Will have + Past participle form of the verb

Future perfect continuous form : Will have been + present participle form [verb + Ing]

➤ **Future perfect simple Examples:**

Affirmative : **By next month** Sami **will have bought** a new bike.

Negative : **By next month** Sami **won't have bought** a new bike.

Interrogative : **Will** Sami **have bought** a new bike **by next month**

➤ **Future perfect continuous examples:**

Affirmative : **By 4pm** I **Will have been playing** video games for 2 hours.

Negative : **By 4pm** I **won't have been playing** video games for 2 hours.

Interrogative : **Will** you **have been playing** video games for 2 hours **by 4pm?**

Future perfect simple

5. By the end of the week, we (to prepare) for the event for two months.
6. By next summer, they (to work) on their startup for five years.
7. By tomorrow, I (to wait) at the airport for five hours.
8. By the end of this month, she (to teach) English for ten years.
9. By next Friday, he (to travel) around the world for six months.
10. By next year, they (to save) money for their wedding for two years.
