## **Future Perfect Simple & Continuous**



**Context of Use:** The Future Perfect is a tense that expresses the idea that something will occur before another action. It can also show that something will happen before a specific time. It is generally used with expressions like by, by then, by that time, by the 24th, and by 2070...

Future perfect simple Form: Will have + Past participle form of the verb

Future perfect continuous form: Will have been + present participle form [verb + Ing]

#### Future perfect simple Examples:

Affirmative: By next month Sami will have bought a new bike.

Negative: By next month Sami won't have bought a new bike.

Interrogative: Will Sami have bought a new bike by next month

### Future perfect continuous examples:

Affirmative: By 4pm | Will have been playing video games for 2 hours.

Negative: By 4pm I won't have been playing video games for 2 hours.

Interrogative: Will you have been playing video games for 2 hours by 4pm?
